Parents volunteer at a higher rate than the general population



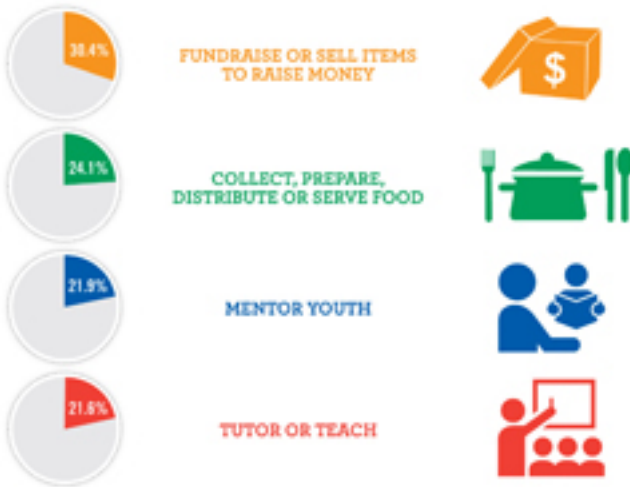
WORKING MOTHERS ARE KEY

Even though they are some of the busiest Americans, nearly 4 in 10 volunteer



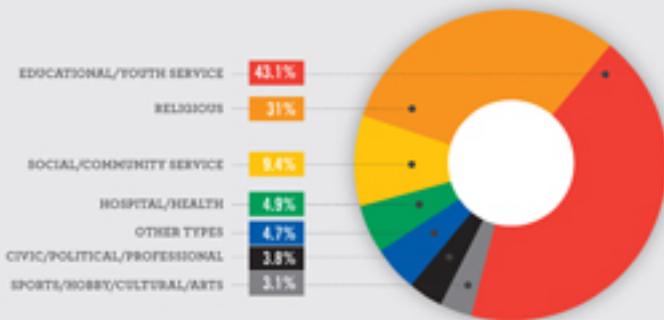
HELPING THOSE IN NEED
